

Primary schools across County Carlow are invited to participate in an inspiring literacy initiative that will engage 4th, 5th, and 6th class students in the Right to Read Programme by Carlow County Council - Economic Development & Library Service, Dear Principal, Carlow County Development Partnership, Carlow College, St. Patricks and Carlow

As part of a coordinated national framework for literacy support, the Right to Read Campaign is designed to reinforce reading development and support learning both in and beyond the classroom. This initiative aligns with national strategies such as Kilkenny Skillnet Delivering Equality of Opportunity in Schools (DEIS) and early childhood education programmes, offering continuity and targeted assistance for children, families, and adults with lower literacy levels. It also aims to build a sustainable, integrated literacy support model that is consistent across all local authorities.

To spark creativity and community engagement proud to announce the launch of a Short Story Competition for 4th, 5th and 6th class pupils throughout the county. Students are invited to submit a story on the theme "My Favourite Local Business", accompanied by:

4th Class - Who's your favourite author? 5th Class - What do you want to be when you grow up? 6th Class - What's your favourite place or thing to do in Carlow?

Exciting prizes will be awarded to the top 2 entries in each category, and each participating pupil will receive a certificate recognizing their effort and creativity.

Right to Read Campaign

As local champions of literacy support and development, Carlow libraries will take a leading role in delivering the aims of the Right to Read Campaign. Libraries have the experience and resources to develop and enhance literacy activities in cooperation with other key agencies. Their position as a central service within communities, while operating within a country-wide network, makes libraries valuable

catalysts for consolidating literacy support and activities throughout local government services. Indeed, the public libraries' strategy, Opportunities for All, represents a new era for libraries to deliver national objectives locally through a collaborative approach.

self-sufficient individuals with high levels of well-being, self-worth and strong basic skills to take advantage of employment opportunities. The Right to Read Campaign offers a practical and achievable route to support the diverse spectrum of literacy needs in our communities more effectively, collectively and sustainably and strengthen the delivery of high-quality services for literacy skills development.

Competition Rules

The competition is open to all Primary schools in County Carlow. The entries shall be restricted to pupils in 4th, 5th and 6th class.

The Short Story shall be titled "My Favourite Local Business" and be a maximum of 400 words. The class piece shall be no more than 300 words.

4th Class Who's your favourite author?
5th Class What do you want to be when you grow up?
6th Class What's your favourite place or thing to do in Carlow?

The story will include the name of the local business, who they are, what the business does and why it is their favourite business.

All entries will consist of application form and completed short story. The school will forward all completed applications in an envelope marked - My Favourite Local Business - to be posted/delivered to Carlow LEO, Enterprise House, O'Brien Rd Carlow. Closing date for entries shall be 4.00 PM on Friday 25th October at 4pm. Late entries will not be accepted.

Following closing date all applications will be assessed and the top story in 4th, 5th and 6th class per school will be invited to an award ceremony to be held in Carlow College on Thursday 13th November 2025.

Each school winner will receive a prize voucher of €20 and certificate of participation. Each school receives a framed certificate as acknowledgement of their support for the program.

The Overall Top 2 County Competition Winners from 4th,5th and 6th class will be announced at the awards ceremony and will receive the following prize.

A draw for participating teachers for a €50 hospitality voucher will be held on the night.

A draw for participating schools for a €1,000 Jones Voucher & entries bound into a book will also be held.
