**7.1 Standing in the name of Cllr. Adrienne Wallace**

Council notes:

That the current escalation of violence was instigated by the attempt to evict 28 Palestinian families from the Sheikh Jarrah area of Jerusalem as part of an ongoing and systematic campaign of illegal Israeli settlements and ethnic cleansing of Palestinians from their land;

That Israel's military operation in Gaza amounts to war crimes;

That the ongoing ethnic cleansing of Palestinians, and illegal settlement expansion, represents flagrant breaches of international law;

That a growing list of human rights organisations have determined that Israel's action amounts to apartheid, including the latest report by Human Rights Watch;

That normal co-operation with the Israeli state is therefore untenable in these circumstances;

Council recognises the rich history of solidarity and activism in Ireland with Palestinians, including very recent demonstrations; and that such solidarity can be an

important tool in dismantling support for Israel's actions.

Council therefore condemns the actions of the Israeli state, as listed above, and agrees to write to the Irish Government and the UK Government, urging them to expel from office Israeli ambassadors, with immediate effect.
