#### 4.3 Leader Programme 2014 – 2020

Brian O'Donovan, Senior Executive Officer presented this report. The LEADER programme has been operated across the EU since 1991 to benefit rural communities through active engagement and community-led local development. In Ireland under the LEADER programme for 2014-2020, a budget of €250 million in grant aid was being provided to support rural communities and local businesses. The Carlow Leader programme for 2014-2020 was awarded €6.4m (Project Support, Administration and Animation). The Transitional LEADER programme came into effect on 1st April 2021. It will bridge the gap between the wind-up of the current 2014-2020 LEADER programme and the start of the next EU programme. Other changes to the LEADER programme include an increase in the maximum rate of aid for enterprises and commercial projects from 50% to 75%. Members paid tribute to Mary Lawlor and to her contribution to the LEADER programme throughout the county. B. O'Donovan responded to questions raised by members. Report noted.

### 4.4 Presentation on County Carlow Community Response Forum – Keep Well Campaign/Communications/Community Supports

This Council acknowledges that many of the trade elements are already in placeand does not need the addition

of corporations being able to sue the Irish government through the Investor Court System (ICS) when any new laws affect their profits. This council stands against the Investor Court System (ICS) and calls this constituency a CETA-Free Zone.

This Council resolves to write to the Minister for Trade, the Minister for Local government and the Taoiseach to outline this position. It further resolves to publicise the council's concerns about CETA and to circulate this motion with other Councils as correspondence for consideration."
