#### 2.1 Draft Litter Management Plan 2021 - 2023

#### 3.2 Official Launch of Borris Viaduct

M. Rainey, Director of Service, presented this report. The Borris Railway Viaduct is one of County Carlow's best-loved and most iconic landmarks. The Viaduct was part of the Bagenalstown and Wexford Railway, which first opened in December 1898. The Viaduct is constructed of limestone, it is 800 metres in length and consists of 16 arches of 11 metres span and is over 50 metres above the North Leinster Heritage Drive and River Mountain.

With support of funding from the Rural Regeneration & Development Fund, Carlow County Council in partnership with Borris Tidy Towns have regenerated the site to develop the project which includes parking and a linear park that leads visitor to the top of the viaduct. Members noted this report.

"That Carlow County Council write to the Minister for Health and inform him of its disappointment at the Government decision not to pay student nurses. Like all frontline workers at the face of the global pandemic, student nurses sacrificed their movement between hospital or any other residential homes for fears of cross contamination and this excluded them from getting work as support staff. Compared to apprentices who are paid from the day they start it is not until the fourth year of training that year nurses start to get paid. We as a Council respectfully ask the Minister and the government to reverse the decision."
