#### 3.0 Consideration of Reports and Recommendations

# 3.1 Presentation from Lightsource Renewable Energy Ireland on proposed solar farm within the electoral area.

Aidan Collins from Lightsource Renewable Energy Ireland made a presentation on a proposal for a solar farm on lands at Straboe, Tullow, Co. Carlow. He advised that there would be a Community Information Event in Grange GAC Club Hall, Killerig on 7<sup>th</sup> June 2023. Aidan expects the planning application to be lodged in the coming months.

The members thanked Aidan for his very informative presentation and also complimented him on reaching out to the community before lodging the planning application.

### 3.2 **Housing Progress Report**

Brian O'Donovan, Senior Executive Officer, briefed the members on progress to date in the Tullow Municipal District. He advised that 9 units are currently being progressed under RLS Scheme in Slaney House and 21 houses are proposed for Castledermot Road which should commence in the near future.

Brian also answered queries raised in relation to maintenance issues in River View Apartments.

Michael Brennan, Director of Services agreed to check with Department of Equality, Children and Disability whether refugees are being properly vetted before arriving in Tullow where concerns were raised by the members.

## 3.3 Area Engineer's Report

Pat Harrington, Senior Executive Engineer, distributed a map of surface dressing and advised that it will commence on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> May for a period of approximately seven days, subject to weather. A Junction Vegetation Management Update Report indicating the 149 junctions that would be cut in a two week period commencing as every year on **21**<sup>st</sup> **June** was also distributed. An update of the programme was also provided.

Pat also provided a report on Community Involvement Schemes and advised that all funding provided would be used at Altamont. In the event of future funding being received, projects would be progressed in the order originally approved by the members which is:
